As you can imagine, harvest time in the Palouse is a busy affair. Combines and harvest trucks all over the place bringing in the grain for storage and shipment. I was 2 weeks into my first call in Endicott when word came that a horrible, freak accident happened to a parishioner. The combine he was in flipped over on one of the steep hillsides that they harvest, killing him instantly. It was devastating. And the family and crew were only a 1/4 of the way harvesting the grain on thousands of acres.

It was the first time I witnessed a Harvest Bee. When a tragedy hits a family in the midst of harvest, the normal routine stops. Harvest trucks and combines from all over the place converge on the grieving family's farm and proceed to get the crop in. On this moment, between 15-20 combines and over 35 trucks showed up and thousands of acres done in 2 days. And the food. Think of a Church potluck only 50 times bigger.

It was, and continues to be, an amazing memory! People showed up. Doing what they could in the midst of grief and chaos. And the grieving family was able to breathe.

I relay this experience to you in order to say thank you all for showing up in the midst of the business of your lives. You show up in worship to be a presence to people in our sanctuary who may be going through their own personal chaos or just need the assurance that they are not alone in the world. You show up in your everyday routine, in your work place or wherever you find yourself, and when you extend a hand of grace, a smile of comfort, you bring Christ into the world. You allow people to breathe. In all that you do, in all the varied ways that you provide space for people to be themselves ... thank you.

I think our calling as disciples of Christ is, to the best of our ability, to try and embody the words of Jesus"And remember, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."



Learning more about Racism

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America introduces "Now Is the Time: A Study Guide for ELCA Declaration to People of African Descent" to help congregations wrestle with the meaning of the declaration, adopted at the 2019 Churchwide Assembly, and its accompanying explanation.

In the declaration, the ELCA "apologizes to people of African descent for its historical complicity in slavery and its enduring legacy of racism in the United States and globally. We lament the white church's failure to work for the abolition of slavery and the perpetuation of racism in this church." "Now Is the Time" stresses realism, self-examination and accountability as the church acknowledges and apologizes for the history and impact of slavery and systemic racism in the United States and globally. The study guide focuses on deepening our understanding of this history as participants engage in often-difficult conversation and reflection to move the church toward racial healing and justice.

We will begin a 5 week study after church, beginning on September 11. Pastor Janine and David Grice will be facilitating. We hope you can join us!

Over the course of the assembly, voting members Hear reports and review the work of churchwide officers, leaders and units; Receive and consider proposals from synod assemblies; Elect officers, board members and other leaders as specified by the constitution or bylaws; Establish ELCA churchwide policy; Worship together; Adopt a budget; and Conduct other business related to the ELCA churchwide organization.


