A Psalm for Reformation Sunday

(I can't help but think of all the folks who have fled their homes...seeking refuge. Refuge from war. Refuge from storms. Refuge from trouble of all kinds. Be their shelter and strength, Lord. In our trouble...may we find in you a safe place to rest.)

(And it seems like it's changing so fast, God. The earth...the climate...the nation..our community. But you've seen it all before...and we have nothing to fear because you are God of all.)

though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea;

though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult.

(As I am writing this, Hurricane Ian is flooding Florida. Around the globe, hurricanes and earthquakes, floods and fires, droughts and tornadoes destroy homes and communities and wreak devastation with relentless certitude. We do not always understand this fragile relationship we have with this earth...but dear God, help us care for one another when storms rage.)

There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved; God will help it when the morning dawns.

(Are you really there, God? In the city? And in the tent city, too? Are you there...where garbage and needles litter our streets? Where there is so much violence and crime? You say you are. Show us the waters of gladness in our cities.)

The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts. The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

(When people use your word to prop up nations and kingdoms ...when they stir up division in the name of righteousness and purity...Your voice...your Word made flesh in Jesus...speaks grace and melts our hard and angry hearts. May we hear clearly your love for us...for all. You are with us. Emmanuel..."God with us.")
