Do you live in a place with a small closet? Do you have only enough room in your closet and drawers for either winter clothes or summer clothes, but not both? Twice a year, I take my clothes from one season and put them in some plastic bins, and take out the clothes for the upcoming season. I get tired of my winter layers that I wear for eight and a half months and am glad to store them away for a while. My summer clothes remind me of outdoor activities that require sunblock instead of wool. But I am also surprised every year by something I forgot that I had bought or surprised by an article of clothing that I kept. It is hard to get rid of something that fits and is comfortable or has good memories attached to it. Even if it is worn out.

The job of an interim pastor is helping a congregation to adjust from one season in their life to another season. Change is stressful. It just is. And we all tend to lean toward what is familiar and avoid the unfamiliar. You, as a

congregation, have adjusted very well to the changes brought about by Matt and Janine's departure. You have expressed your grief but also the joy in continuing your shared mission. Saying good-bye to what was once good, healthy, fun, Christ-centered and Spirit-inspired, is difficult, painful and takes time. Saying hello to what is new, unfamiliar, challenging, even if it is Christ-centered and Spirit-inspired, is stressful, uncomfortable and takes time. This goes for many things in life, as you well know. There are relationships that are for a time, or change over time, and it can be difficult to let that change happen. I know some people in their 50s who are still trying to parent their adult offspring. They have not let the change occur in that relationship.

When you retire from working, when you graduate from school, when your kids get older more rapidly than you expected, when you feel your body aging more rapidly than you expected. There is a letting go and a waiting for what is next. There is uncertainty. But God does not promise us certainty. God only asks that we have faith, in other words, that we trust. Faith accepts uncertainty. In church life together, in your own personal lives, what do you think you (we) need to let go of? What do you (we) need to say "hello" to?

In closing, here is my ask: that God would bless all of us as we journey through this interim time together and with the Spirit's help, discern what we need to hold on to and what we need to release, and that God would surprise us in joyful and profound ways.


