This time of year, Advent and Christmas, inside the church and in our society in general, we know what to expect. The predictable nature of the holidays is what makes them comforting. Uncertainty and change are stressful. We don't like to be in limbo, in an in-between time, in a time of transition. We like certainty, predictability, routine and comfort.

You know what it is like. You know what it means to live with uncertainty. If you have ever moved, or had children, or got married, or became ill, or lost a loved one, or lost a job, or went bankrupt, you know.

This church, American Lutheran, is in a time of uncertainty right now. You have lost your former pastors; they served



you well for almost 2 decades. They helped make this church what it is today. They had a profound effect on many lives. They have been gone for over a year now. And your new pastor has not arrived yet. As a congregation we are in limbo, in an in-between time.

I happen to think that we are much more useful to God in these times, when we are a bit off balance. It is rather difficult, after all, to dance when both feet are firmly planted. God works well even in times that feel a bit chaotic to us.

And the familiar Christmas story from the gospel of Luke, chapter 2, is really a story about a couple, a family, caught in the stress of geo-political forces beyond their control, disrupted lives, rulers who killed their own people, having to flee one's home out of fear for their lives. It is a story about a chaotic time, for a family and a whole nation.

That is exactly where God chose to enter the human story in a new way. God is not afraid of chaos. We can't overwhelm God with our dilemmas. We can't even frustrate God with our stubbornness, immaturity and cruelty. God is infinitely creative and not only entered the human story long ago as a poor Jewish baby boy, but comes to us everyday in unusual disguises, to bless us, even in spite of ourselves.

Wherever rulers cause misery, wherever people are forced to flee out of fear, wherever new born babies face a fraught future, God is there. In the midst of it all. God does not promise us certainty, or predictability, but rather blessing and faith. God's promise is to be present, even in the midst of our uncertainty. This Christmas expect to be surprised by God's presence, look for it, and give thanks for it when you see it. Share it. Be it, for someone else. And then give thanks and praise to Emmanuel, God with us.


